Nursing Courses

Every RN to BSN student will begin the nursing program in NURS 3345 Role Transition to Professional Nursing. Although we have no pre-requisites, ENGL I and II are recommended to be taken early in the program if not already completed. Technical writing can be taken concurrently with any nursing course. Twenty-nine hours of your ADN coursework will be applied toward your BSN.
