2017 brought new honors, new facilities, and new services to Methodist Mansfield

In the last year, Methodist Mansfield Medical Center celebrated its first 10 years of service to the community and had many successes — recognition for nursing and safety, the construction of new facilities, and the introduction of new technologies. Read on to see some of our proudest moments from 2017.

NEW LEVELS OF EXCELLENCE

 Methodist Mansfield achieved Magnet[®] designation, the gold standard for patient care, impeccable service, and nursing expertise, from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

HIGH STANDARDS OF SAFETY

- Methodist Mansfield earned two consecutive A grades — the highest possible rating — for Patient Safety in The Leapfrog Group® Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 Hospital Safety Score ratings. This is the highest rating possible by the independent hospital watchdog.
- Our new falls prevention program, implemented through collaboration with Mayo Clinic, has led to fewer than 1 fall per 1,000 patient days.

OUR COMMUNITY REACH

- The new Methodist Center for Diagnostic Imaging – Mansfield and the Alexander Medical Pavilion opened at 2975 E. Broad St. The imaging center offers the first high-field open MRI machine in the community and is able to deliver high-quality, cost-effective medical imaging care for patients.
- We topped out a second professional office building (POB II) at the southeastern corner of Hospital Drive and Matlock Road. The 82,000-square-foot, four-story building will house a variety of physician offices and hospital services when completed in spring 2018.

EXPANDING OUR FACILITY

- Two new operating rooms are dedicated to neurosurgery and trauma, equipping the hospital for its first craniotomy procedure.
- A third cardiac catheterization lab expanded the hospital's cardiology services and accommodates electrophysiology and interventional radiology procedures.

- We added 36 beds to the medicalsurgical unit and 10 beds to the cardiac telemetry unit.
- Our new 16-bed cardiovascular and postcoronary intensive care units are equipped with intensive care monitoring 24 hours a day for patients with cardiac conditions.

NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND SERVICES

- Our new obstetrics emergency department (OB/ED) offers 24/7 emergency services for pregnant women.
- New electromagnetic navigation bronchoscopy aids in diagnosing earlier stages of lung cancer, treating lung tumors, resolving airway obstructions, and curing inflammation and infections.
- The LINX[®] Reflux Management System offers a lifelong solution to gastroesophageal reflux disease.
- New 3-D mammography increases both the sensitivity and specificity of breast screenings.

Gladly giving babies a strong start

Two thousand two — that's how many babies Methodist Mansfield Medical Center helped bring into the world in fiscal year 2017. Nearly 500 of those infants benefited from the advanced medical support in the hospital's Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

More parents are choosing Methodist Mansfield because of these little success stories. The hospital has nationally recognized quality care and is home to a welcoming atmosphere and a caring labor and delivery staff.

The spacious, medically advanced, private labor/delivery/recovery suites enable a family-centered approach to care. To give you and your baby time to form that family bond, Methodist Mansfield encourages skin-to-skin

contact and offers lactation consults during and after mom's delivery. Also in support of breastfeeding, Methodist Mansfield was the first hospital in southeastern Tarrant County to provide a convenient drop-off location for donor breast milk in collaboration with the Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas.

We also offer a Fit4Baby® prenatal workout

program designed just for the expecting mom. The Fit4Mom[®]-led program includes cardio, strength and core training, stretching, and meditation.

TEAMING UP IN THE COMMUNITY

Helping patients feel more confident on the inside and beautiful on the outside, Methodist Mansfield and Walgreens on Broad Street have joined together to give select patients mini makeovers. What started with Walgreens donating to the hospital as a charity effort soon flourished into a creative idea that not only gives back to the community but also helps patients feel relaxed through a spalike break.

The first recipient of the weekly makeovers was Midlothian mother Lacey Wright, who gave birth to adorable triplets on Saturday, July 8. Carrying the triplets longer than expected, Lacey went into labor at 32 weeks. Identical twin sons, Marshall and Nash, and daughter Oakley were treated in the NICU for a short period to stabilize their health.
