#### **Methodist Mansfield Grows Brighter**

This year, Methodist Mansfield Medical Center celebrated the opening of a newly expanded Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, and Telemetry Floor. The \$37 million expansion doubled the size of the Emergency Department to 35 treatment rooms, added eight ICU treatment rooms, and included 36 telemetry patient rooms. Laura Irvine, president of Methodist Mansfield, remarked, "We have a great staff, and we are thankful that so many members of our communities have entrusted Methodist Mansfield with their health. This expansion allows us to continue to deliver quality clinical services in a patient-centered, modern environment of care."

# \$465 Million in Economic Impact

In fiscal 2010, Methodist Health System contributed more than \$465 million to our local communities, providing over \$87 million in uncompensated charity care, and paid \$378 million in employee salaries and benefits. We employ 6,945 professionals.

Locally, Methodist Mansfield Medical Center provided more than \$11.2 million in unreimbursed charity care and governmentsponsored indigent health care. We employ 697 health care professionals, making us one of the largest employers in the Mansfield area.
