We're growing along with you

Less than two years after the grand opening of the new Methodist Richardson Medical Center at President George Bush Highway and Renner Road, the hospital is expanding to meet the growing needs of our communities:

- We have completed a new inpatient unit on our second floor with 25 private patient rooms, and a 12-bed unit on our fourth floor is now home to Children's HealthSM and Methodist Richardson Pediatric Services. These are two names that you trust bringing quality care conveniently close to home.
- We continue to add advanced diagnostic equipment to enhance our patient care, including 3-D mammography, endobronchial

ultrasound, and an additional 64-slice CT scanner for emergency stroke diagnosis and treatment.

- Methodist Richardson Cancer Center now offers image-guided radiotherapy with the fully integrated TrueBeamTM linear accelerator.
- The Methodist Richardson Medical Center – Campus for Continuing Care became home to the all-new Older Adult Behavioral Health Unit, offering short-

term, crisis stabilization for older adults coping with mental health disorders and addiction.

- Through an affiliate joint venture arrangement, two new Methodist Urgent Care locations opened in Richardson and The Colony.

Committed to a healthier community

Methodist Health System and Methodist Richardson Medical Center are improving the health of our community with these initiatives:

- **Methodist Generations.** This program offers a variety of wellness activities, social events, and educational outreach for people ages 55 and older.
- **Asian Breast Health Outreach Project (ABHOP).** Last year, this program provided 414 mammogram screenings, 71 diagnostic exams, and 14 biopsies. ABHOP also provided breast health education to uninsured and underinsured Asian-American women.
- **Mobile mammography.** Methodist's mobile mammography unit brought breast cancer screening directly to 2,790 women this year, including 1,642 in the Methodist Richardson Medical Center service area. Area businesses are also encouraged to invite

the mobile mammography unit to their location for the convenience and well-being of their female employees.

Lots of little hands and feet! That's one way to describe the baby boom Methodist Richardson Medical Center experienced in fiscal year 2015, delivering a record 1,883 babies.

The baby boom is a reflection of the explosive growth in our communities, but that parents choose Methodist Richardson is a reflection of the welcoming atmosphere of our labor and delivery unit.

Our large, medically advanced, private labor/delivery/recovery suites enable a family-centered approach to care. To give you and your baby time

to form that family bond, Methodist Richardson encourages skin-to-skin contact and offers lactation consults to help moms and babies learn to breastfeed.

If your newborn requires additional medical support, we have a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). This year we delivered our first set of triplets, and we're happy to share that our youngest preemie to date, born at less than 23 weeks, is now thriving. Baby Ruby Silva and her family attended our first Go Purple for Premies NICU reunion, along with other babies born in the past year.
